Expected progress is one step per term - three steps over three terms.

Where attainment on entry is below ARE, practitioners must aim for accelerated progress from the child's starting point to close the gap. Especially those for whom the school receives additional funding.

Most children on entry into nursery are likely to be working within the 30-50 band, having shown competence in the preceding 22-36 band.

Most children on entry into Reception are likely to be working within the 40-60 band, having shown competence in the preceding 30-50 band.

Most children will exit Reception with Early Learning Goal (ELG) at Expected Level or having attained a good level of development (GLD)

End of Reception judgements for the baseline for assessing progress through Key Stage 1:

- Children who achieved ELG at 'expected level would be expected to reach ARE at the end of Key Stage 1.
- Children who exceeded the ELG would be expected to be working beyond ARE at the end of Key Stage 1.
- Children who did not achieve the ELG should be assessed at their level of achievement (e.g. 40-60D) and progress across Key Stage 1 measured from that step. (progress should be 6 steps from starting point).
